
Dear Friends of St. Luke School,

The season of giving is upon us. On behalf of the students, faculty, and staff of St. Luke School, I want to express our sincere appreciation for your continued generosity through the Annual Fund Drive. As stewards of this school, we embrace the enormous responsibility of providing St. Luke students with a quality academic, spiritual, and physical environment for learning and growing. We can only succeed at such a lofty undertaking with your financial support.

Last year, the Annual Fund Drive was incredibly successful. I am grateful to last year's chairs Mike Nordtvedt and Mildred Medina, and our Development Director Jess Cunningham for their outstanding work. We exceeded our monetary goal of \$165K, raising a total of \$209K. This year we have an increased goal of \$175K to meet the need for teacher professional development, especially in the areas of assessment and differentiation, and continued support for resources in technology, engineering, the arts, and math (STEAM), all while providing financial assistance to make a Catholic IB education affordable for our St. Luke community. In addition, the annual fund drive, coupled with a gift from a private foundation and the Fulcrum Foundation, allowed us to award over \$450,480.00 in financial support. I continue to believe that the success of our efforts cannot be judged in dollars alone but, more importantly, in the number of families participating each year. As reflected in the numbers, we again had an impressive involvement of families and staff support for our Annual Fund Drive. I am confident that this year's chairs Pam and Arnel Reyes will see the same commitment and positive energy as we launch the new drive.

The Annual Fund was not our only large success. We had tremendous ascendancies with all of our other development efforts. The St. Luke Jog-A-Thon brought in enough revenue that we did not have to add an additional spring fundraiser! And the 2022 spring auction revenue to the school increased by 50%, from \$70K to \$105K. That's an incredible increase.

Our development efforts last year helped us reach our goal of teachers having computers with the most up-to-date applications and systems. We made significant progress toward providing 1:1 access to technology, mainly Chromebooks, for all students in Kindergarten through eighth grade. These tech resources allow students to access on-line resources, engage with resources to support the IB units of study, and share their knowledge in classroom and school-wide presentations. Staff members can now access updated technology to improve communications regarding student progress and to share resources with colleagues throughout the world. Providing quality, professional development to staff is one of our main goals in the strategic plan. Thankfully, we were able to provide all of our teachers with professional development both in best practices to engage learners, as well as additional education in assessment and communications about student growth that align with IB standards. Our teachers will advance best practices that will move all St. Luke students forward within the IB framework into inquiry and critical thinking and, most importantly, how to connect service as a way of living out our faith by giving to others.








Dear Friends of St. Luke School and Parish,




ANNUAL FUND 2021-22



■ School Needs 70% ■ Tuition Assistance 13% ■ Technology 13% ■ Endowment 4%


INCOME
